PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

- 1. During the period 15 April 1971 to 23 April 1971 the Battalion was in "stand-down" completing preparations for redeployment to Camp Pendleton, California. On 23 and 24 April 1971 the remaining elements of the Battalion, including Companies "A" and "B", Transport Company, and Headquarters and Service Company were embarked aboard assigned shipping for transport to CONUS.
- a. On 19 April 1971 the Battalion executed three (3) convoys to Deep Water Pier, staging all equipment and mobile loaded supplies for subsequent embarkation on 23 April 1971.
- b. The Battalion Headquarters, Transport Company, and elements of Company "B" and Headquarters and Service Company were embarked aboard the USS ANCHORAGE, ISD-36, on 23 April 1971 and departed RVN that same day arriving at San Diego, California on 11 May v1971. Embarked aboard were 86 vehicles, and supplies which totaled 657.6 short tons and 16,639 square feet.
- c. Company "A" with elements of Company "B" and Headquarters and Service Company were embarked aboard the USS DURHAM, LKA-114, on 23 and 24 April 1971, departing RVN on 24 April 1971 and arriving at Long Beach California on 10 May 1971. Embarked aboard were 130 vehicles, and supplies which totaled 748 short tons and 19,581 square feet.
- 2. Upon arrival at Camp Pendleton, California the Battalion, with a reduced strength of eight (8) officers and twenty-three (23) enlisted, in coordination with their host unit, Service Battalion, 1st Marine Division (FMF), initiated preparations for deactivation. All supplies and equipment were redistributed throughout the Division or turned in to appropriate agencies in accordance with disposition instructions received from Headquarters, U. S. Marine Corps and/or MCSA, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. All transactions were completed by 13 June 1971.
- 3. After completion of all requirements for deactivation, the Battalion was deactivated and the colors retired at an appropriate ceremony on 14 June 1971.
